



Troop 63 Policy

- Scouts and Leaders should be in proper uniform for all Troop meetings and events:
Proper uniform:
Class “A” uniform means Scout shirt with proper patches, neckerchief w/ slide, green pants or shorts (Pants-official scout type or other olive green **non-jean** type with loops so a scout belt can be worn). Green scout socks. Hats are optional. Some scouts have Boy Scout or Troop 63 hats, which are fine. Non-scout hats should be worn only on non-scout events.
- Troop meetings begin at 7:00 PM and end between 8:15 and 8:30 PM. Meetings are held at the Assumption Church Hall unless otherwise notified.
- After 6-months of absence from meetings, with no word or contact from the family, it will be assumed that the Scout is no longer interested and will be dropped from the rooster.
- Parents are expected to participate in Troop activities on occasion including event planning, buying food, transportation, help with committee work, as well as our annual fundraiser. (Xmas Tree sale)
- Parents must attend a 2-hour certification session on Youth Protection.
- Boys will behave in a Scout like manner at all Scout events and meetings.
This includes:
 - **Living by the Scout Oath, Law, and Outdoor Code.**
 - **Not teasing or taunting other scouts, or behaving inappropriately.**
 - **No fighting, spitting or bad language.**
 - **Anyone caught stealing will be dismissed from the Troop.**
 - **Showing respect for other Scouts and Adult Leaders.**
 - **Buddy System: When at a campout or other Scout event, scouts leaving the site or area for any reason must notify an Adult Leader and travel in pairs or larger groups. All scouts must be with a “buddy”. No Scout should ever be alone while camping.**
- The following are **prohibited** by BSA at any Scout event:
 - **Relieving yourself in non-designated areas, or areas where you are visible to other Scouts.**
 - **Electronic games, devises, radios, TV’s, CD players, laser pointers or other electronic or battery-operated equipment (other than flashlights).**
 - **Fireworks, Fire paste, Fire jelly, Butane or liquid fuel lighters, and liquid fuels of any type.**
 - **Propane gas appliances may be used under Adult Leader supervision only.**
 - **Sheath knives, butterfly knives, and survival knives.**
 - **Only knives allowed are legal length Scout or pocket type knives with blades no longer than 3”.**
 - **Camouflaged clothing and open toed shoes.**
- **Alcohol is not permitted at any Scout activity**
- **In accordance with BSA policy all Scout events are non-smoking.**
